

WCP4 Arrival and Other Administrative Details

If you are coming to Melbourne, you are almost certain to be arriving by air. If you are staying at Ormond College, your best bet is to take a taxi. You won't get much change out of AUS\$50. (But note that tipping is not expected in Australia.) The journey takes about 20-40 minutes, depending on the time of day.

Alternatively, there is an airport bus (the Skybus, cost \$16), which will take you to the terminal in Spencer St, downtown Melbourne. But you have to get from there to Ormond College. The distance is not so far, but it is not an easy journey if you don't know Melbourne; so your best bet is again to take a taxi from the bus terminal. That will cost about \$10.

Ormond College is on the campus of Melbourne University. The taxi driver will probably know where Melbourne University is, but probably not know where Ormond College is. Tell the driver that the main entrance of the College is on the corner of Royal Parade and College Crescent. You will recognise the College by its tall spire. The taxi can go up the drive, which ends in front of the entrance to the Main Building. The College Office is just inside on the right. The staff there will check you in. If you are arriving at an odd time e.g. late at night it would be a good idea to email the College and let them know.

If you are not staying in the college, but in a hotel, your best bet to get there is again a taxi. How to get to Ormond College from there depends, of course, on where you are. Ask at the hotel for directions. Ormond College is on the North West corner of the Melbourne University campus.

Registration for the conference is in the College JCR. The registration desk will be open from 4pm until 7pm on Sunday. Registration is to be paid in cash (Australian dollars). The opening address is at 7.30pm in the JCR, followed by a reception at 9pm. For latecomers, the registration desk will be open again Monday, 8-9am and lunchtime. The University is a short walk from Lygon St in Carlton. Lygon St a kilometre of various kinds of restaurants, predominantly Italian. You will have no problem getting an early dinner there on Sunday evening if you want one. Information about restaurants will be available at registration.

The conference will then run every day except Wednesday. Wednesday is a free day, and a visit to the wine-growing area of the Mornington Peninsula has been arranged for those who would like to go. Sign up on registration.

The conference ends with the conference dinner on the Friday evening.
